EMERGENCY RESPONSE



With multiple emergency situations, from devastating floods in Morocco and Bangladesh to escalating crises in Syria, Gaza, and Lebanon, the demand for urgent humanitarian response was a major focus for us in 2024.

The resilience of those we serve and the generosity of our supporters was essential. Together, we provided life-saving aid - food, water, and shelter - to thousands of families in need.

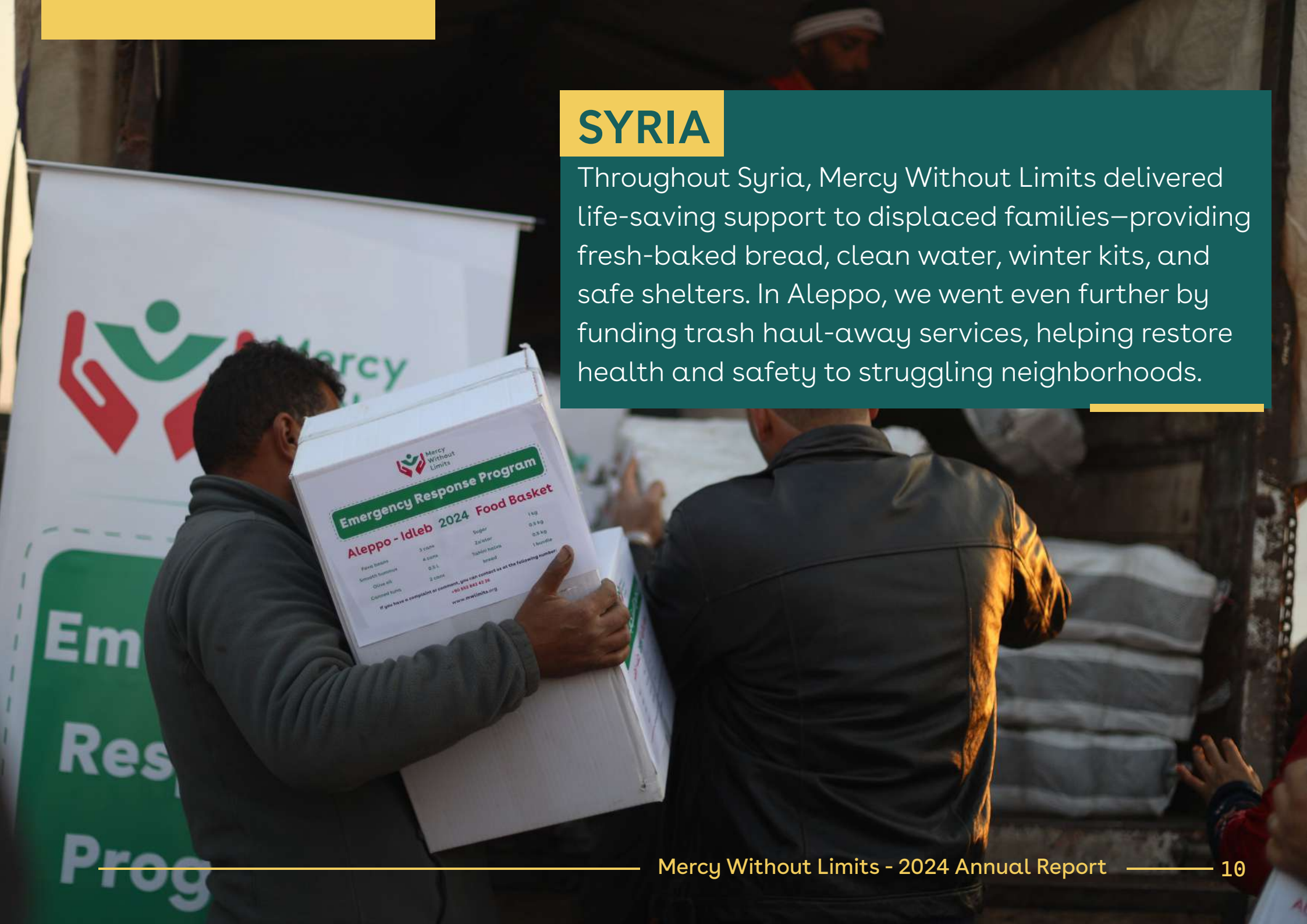

SYRIA

Throughout Syria, Mercy Without Limits delivered life-saving support to displaced families—providing fresh-baked bread, clean water, winter kits, and safe shelters. In Aleppo, we went even further by funding trash haul-away services, helping restore health and safety to struggling neighborhoods.

In Tripoli, families facing displacement received food baskets, clothing, hot meals, and winter kits. Our growing orphan sponsorship program brought added comfort and security to children in need of care.

When floods struck Bangladesh, our local teams worked quickly to distribute hot meals, tents, and clean drinking water to families forced to leave their homes, helping them regain stability in the wake of disaster.



GAZA

In Gaza, Mercy Without Limits provided urgent support: food baskets, hot meals, hygiene kits, tents, and winter essentials, reaching families facing deep hardship and offering them relief in times of crisis.



MOROCCO

After devastating floods in Morocco, we stood beside affected families, delivering warm meals and food baskets to help sustain them through difficulty.



ORPHAN SPONSORSHIP



We as a humanitarian organization prioritize care for children's physical and mental health. We (MWL) take part in this mission by partnering with humanitarian agencies to conduct projects worldwide. Child protection programs MWL is involved in include recreational activities, structured and semi-structured psychological support, and awareness campaigns focusing on subjects like personal hygiene and education. Our orphan projects spanned across Jordan, Syria and Lebanon and included activities such as awareness sessions, psycho-social activities, training courses, rehabilitation of CWD facilities, referrals and cash support.

CASH ASSISTANCE FOR PROTECTION

Our Cash Assistance for Protection program functions in the protection sector of humanitarian efforts in multiple countries. Our aim for this program is to increase protection and aid to those in need, particularly orphans and widows who are among the most vulnerable categories. In this program we (MWL) provide cash assistance that covers the cost of basic necessities, as well as physical and mental healthcare. Cash assistance is also provided for additional services that are determined based on demand.

CHILD SUPPORT

Children, including orphans, across the world who've been displaced due to natural disasters, economic struggles or conflicts, are a vulnerable group that are at higher risk of additional physical, psychological and psychosocial problems due to their difficult situations. As part of our (MWL's) mission we protect children by partnering with humanitarian agencies to conduct projects worldwide. Child protection programs we (MWL) are involved in include recreational activities, structured and semi-structured psychosocial support and awareness campaigns that focus on identity, confidence, and recovery. Orphan sponsorship and empowering caretakers serves as another form of child protection.

REFERRAL CASES

The Child Protection Mobile team provides children in and out of the refugee camps with safe identification, referrals and follow-ups to other available services (such as NFI, Health and Livelihood).



PSS ACTIVITIES (PSYCHOSOCIAL ACTIVITIES)

We have many PSS activities, that raise awareness and educate, including providing a set of structured animated videos to children and their caregivers that incorporated contextualized and culturally-sensitive language.

EARLY RECOVERY



Early recovery programs MWL is involved in include paving roads, building multi-family homes, rehabilitating schools and universities, constructing solar panels and repairing water systems. These projects continue to grow as we expand our reach and extend early recovery aid to additional communities.

EDUCATION

We (MWL) strongly believe in our mission to bring education to underserved communities across the globe. Equipping children and adults with necessary tools they need to develop their knowledge and skills. We believe education will enable them to bring about lasting change to their community. Achieving this goal also enables individuals to be self-sustained through their own talents and abilities, that they have been able to develop through their education.

MWL works towards solving the global education crisis by implementing a variety of education projects, meeting the vast demands of basic educational needs, such as learning kits, rehabilitation for schools, teachers' incentives, etc. Accelerated learning programs have also been made available as an option to disadvantaged children to provide them with equivalent educational standards to match their age. Children with special needs were served in all projects, maintaining equal opportunity for all children to learn.



OUR EDUCATION PROJECTS SPANNED ACROSS MULTIPLE COUNTRIES, INCLUDING, TÜRKİYE, SYRIA, BANGLADESH, LEBANON AND JORDAN. WE CONSTRUCTED CLASSROOMS, SUPPLIED SOLAR POWER AND FUEL FOR SCHOOLS, PROVIDED TRAINING TO LOCAL TEACHERS, DISTRIBUTED TEXTBOOKS, SCHOOL BAGS AND HYGIENE KITS TO STUDENTS, AND SUPPORTED RUNNING COSTS FOR EDUCATION FACILITIES.

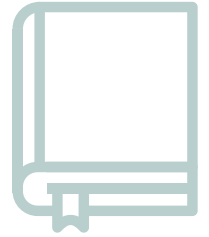

HIGHER EDUCATION

In 2024, Mercy Without Limits renewed its commitment to empowering underprivileged students through higher education. We supported two universities in northern Syria, ensuring that students in these regions had access to quality education and the tools to rebuild their futures. We also support students in Lebanon attending four local universities.

Additionally, in Jordan, we partnered with Zarqa University to provide scholarships to talented and underprivileged students, opening doors to opportunities they might never have had otherwise.

We continue to provide FSL relief in multiple countries by distributing food baskets, hot and ready-to-eat meals and cash for food.

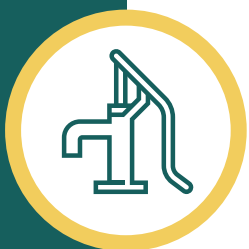

WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE (WASH)



In 2024, many communities worldwide suffered with a lack of access to water and means to maintain adequate hygiene. To improve health and community conditions MWL was grateful to take part in constructing water wells and orchestrating projects that enabled access to safe water and sanitation in several countries. Over this past year we built wells, provided water trucks, supplied clean water tanks and latrines and established sewer systems and water networks.

HEALTHCARE



Health projects MWL takes part in providing bi-annual checkups for all orphans within our care. We also provide medical support and fund surgeries for disabled beneficiaries, among other as-needed care services.

MWL currently supports a healthcare community center in Kansas City, as well.

SHELTER & NON-FOOD ITEMS (SHELTER-NFI)



People worldwide who have been displaced and lost their homes due to tragedy or disaster have found themselves without adequate shelter. MWL provides tents and living quarters to Rohingya Refugees in Bangladesh, and people who have been displaced in Gaza, Türkiye, Syria, Jordan and Lebanon. Shelters were implemented to expand capacity and improve living conditions to help facilitate survival. Among our projects for shelter, our teams were able to rehabilitate homes, install tents for displaced families, distribute bedding, and fuel for heaters to provide relief to beneficiaries, many of whom were children.
